FEEDBACK ANALYSIS - 2015-16

Analysis of Students' Feedback Teaching Environment:

The majority of the U.G. students found the teaching environment to be satisfactory.

Teaching environment suffers due to

- a) Sanctioned strength per division is 150as per Commissioner of Higher Education
- b) No appointments since 1998 for vacant teaching and non teaching posts. However, recently in December 2015, 07 Adhyapak Sahayaks have been appointed.
- c) Inexperienced Ad hoc teaching staff
- d) Majority of students in Arts faculty are first generation learners

Quality of Infrastructure:

The students found the quality of the infrastructure to be quite good in comparison to the other colleges of the district. However, they expressed their dissatisfaction as the Boys' Common Room is temporarily being used as Conference Room.

Faculty Support and its Quality:

a) In context of faculty support and its quality there were mixed opinions. However the majority of the students were satisfied with the support and counselling that they received from the faculty. The students found the experienced faculty and regular classes a plus point as compared to the other colleges of the district. The teaching quality may have got affected as faculty appointments have not been made since 1998, by the Education Department of government of Gujarat. However, recently in December 07 Adhyapak Sahayaks have been appointed.

Fee structure:

The students are quite happy with the fee structure as this is a grant in aid college where the students are charged minimum fees which ranges between Rs. 600 to 1400 per annum.

The SC/ST/OBC and Minority students have expressed satisfaction regarding the government scholarship they receive.

Library Support:

The students are given text books prescribed for the subjects in addition to the study material given by the faculty members hence they are satisfied with the support that they receive from the library.

Annexure - III

(7.3) Two Best Practices of the Institution

1. Title of the Practice:-

COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE

2. Goal :-

The University has made it mandatory to maintain 80% students' attendance in the college. Our college has made it as a goal in practical life to have 80% attendance.

3. The Context:-

The above practice helps the college to develop a culture of punctuality and discipline.

4. The Practice:-

The attendance is taken for all the lectures and the students are administered the attendance sheet wherein he has to put his signature in front of his roll number. The attendance sheets are collected and are analysed. On analyses students with poor attendance are informed, warned and their parents are invited by the head of the institution.

5. Evidence of Success.

On implementing the above practice the overall attendance has improved to a great extent.

6. Problems encountered and resources required.

- (a) Students of Arts faculty travel approximately 10 to 20 km. to reach the college. The buses are irregular, as a result the students are not able to attend the first lecture.
- **(b)** The above problem worsens in rainy season.

1. Title of the Practice:-

EDUCATION FOR ALL

2. Goal:-

The objective of college is to give maximum admission to ST/SC/OBC/Female students.

3. The Context:-

The college is situated in a tribal belt which has a very high concentration of tribal students who need higher education to improve their quality of life.

4. The Practice:-

The college follows the guidelines of the affiliating Gujarat University in giving admission to the students and maximum thrust is on ST students.

5. Evidence of Success:-

The ST and economically backward students from remote and tribal areas have been benefited by this practise. It has also helped them in improving their overall personality and quality of life. Due to higher education they are able to get the state and central government jobs reserved for them.

6. Problems encountered and resources required:-

- b) Government of Gujarat has not made any appointments since 1998 which leads to poor student teacher ratio and to resolve this situation the college has to employ Ad hoc faculty. However, recently in December 2015, 07 Adhyapak Sahayaks have been appointed.
 - Similarly the non teaching staff is also inadequate. At present we have only 02 permanent clerks along with 04 Ad hoc Office Assistants which is insufficient for the college of our size. As per the latest workload sheet we require 09 for Class III and 07 for Class IV staff.
