



FEEDBACK ANALYSIS – 2013-14

After analysis we found that the pattern of feedback of 2012-13 has remained same, in the current academic year.

a Analysis of Students' Feedback Teaching Environment:

The majority of the U.G. students found the teaching environment to be good. This feedback was given on the basis of their experience in the college as well as the feedback they received from their friends studying in the other colleges of the district.

Quality of Infrastructure:

They also found the quality of the infrastructure to be very good in comparison to the other colleges of the district.

Faculty Support and its Quality:

In context of faculty support and its quality there were mixed opinions. However the majority of the students were satisfied with the support that they received from the faculty. The teaching quality may have got affected as faculty appointments have not been made since 1998, by the Education Department of government of Gujarat.

Fee structure:

The students are quite happy with the fee structure as this is a grant in aid college where the students are charged minimum fees which ranges between Rs. 600 to 1400 per annum.

Library Support:

The students are given text books prescribed for the subjects in addition to the study material given by the faculty members hence they are quite satisfied with the support that they receive from the library.

(7.3) Two Best Practices of the Institution.

1. Title of the Practice:

Career Guidance and Counselling

Goal:

The aim of Career Guidance and Counselling in the college is to counsel and motivate the students for various types of exams like UPSC, GPSC, RRB, Banking Services CDS etc. To prepare them for interview and soft skills.

The Context:

The college has higher proportion of ST and economically backward students who could be benefited in getting employment if they are properly guided and motivated to prepare themselves for these competitive exams.

The Practice

The Career Guidance and Counselling Cell has been helping career oriented students by counselling them for competitive exams and inspiring them to read and prepare themselves with the relevant study material. The college manages to invite experts for career guidance and motivational lectures.

Evidences of success

The ST and economically backward students from remote and tribal areas have been benefited by this Cell. It has also helped them in their overall personality development. There is positive feedback from the students to continue such a Cell. **Problems encountered and Resources**

Most of the study material of competitive exams is in English whereas the majority of our students belong to Gujarati medium hence they are unable to comprehend properly. But we try our best to sort out this difficulty by informing the teachers and experts to do the needful. The college has received one time grant for Career and Counselling Cell under the head of "Merged Scheme" of UGC XI plan 2007-12.

2. Title of the Practice:-

Compulsory Attendance

Goal :

The University has made it mandatory to maintain 80% students' attendance in the college. Our college has made it as a goal in practical life to have 80% attendance.

The Context:

The above practice helps the college to develop a culture of punctuality and discipline.

The Practice:

The attendance is taken for all the lectures and the students are administered the attendance sheet wherein he has to put his signature in front of his roll number. The attendance sheets are collected and are analysed. On analyses students with poor attendance are informed, warned and their parents are invited by the head of the institution.

Evidence of Success:

On implementing the above practice the overall attendance has improved to a great extent.

Problems encountered and resources required:

Students of Arts faculty travel approximately 10 to 20 k.m. to reach the college. The buses are irregular, as a result the students are not able to attend the first lecture.

The above problem worsens in rainy season.

The College has requested GSRTC - Dahod depot to increase the number of buses and we are awaiting their action.
